INSTALLATION



Step 1 Power

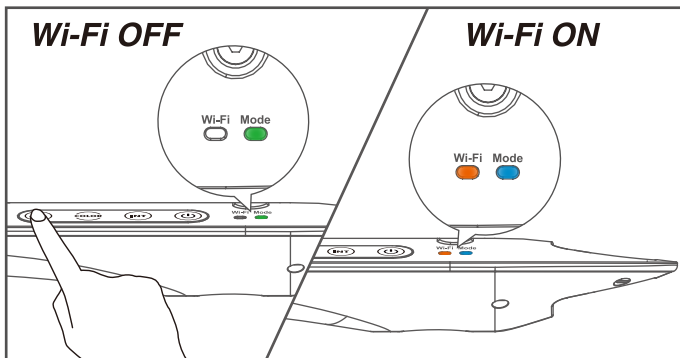
Connect the AP9X to the Power Adapter and plug it into a wall outlet. The Wi-Fi Indicator (B) will be **solid purple** to indicate booting mode (it may take up to 40 seconds).



Step 2 Booting

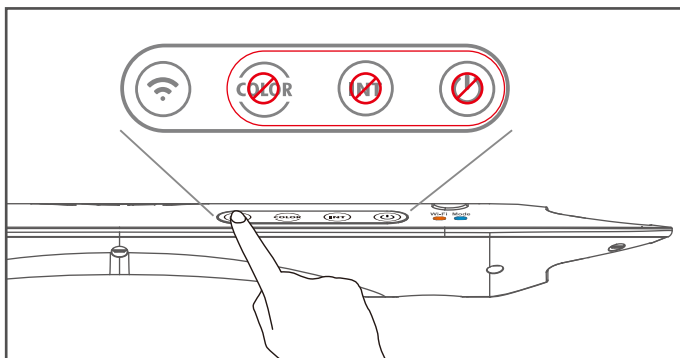
The AP9X requires up to 40 seconds to boot. The Wi-Fi Indicator (B) will first show **solid purple** light, and then disappear. The Mode Indicator (A) will then show **solid green** light.

*** The light will be turned on automatically. DO NOT place the AP9X on any object.**



Step 3 Turn On Wi-Fi for App Connection

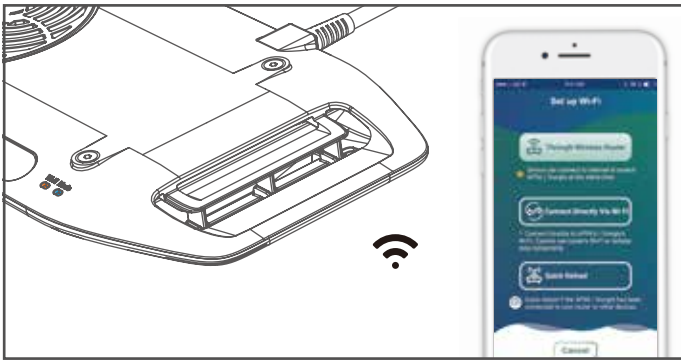
Touch and hold the Wi-Fi (G) button for 3 seconds to turn on Wi-Fi signal. Do the same to turn off Wi-Fi signal.



NOTE Control Buttons Disabled

When the Wi-Fi of AP9X is turned on (Wi-Fi indicator is ON), control buttons are disabled. Turn off Wi-Fi (press "Wi-Fi" (G) button for 3 seconds) for manual control on touch panel.

CONNECTION



Step 1 Download “Kessil WiFi” App

Download the “Kessil WiFi” app* in App Store or Google Play Store.

* Only supports iOS 10.0 or above and Android 5.0 or above



Step 2 Connection

Open the “Kessil WiFi” app and follow the instructions in the app to connect to AP9X. You will need the QR Code Sticker provided in the package. **If you wish to enter the password manually, the password is reverse of the S/N of the AP9X (capital letter matters).**

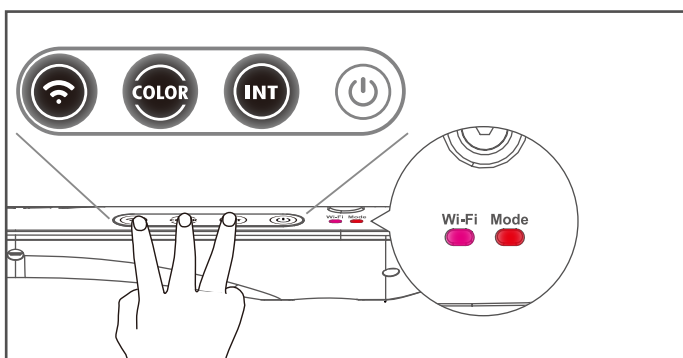
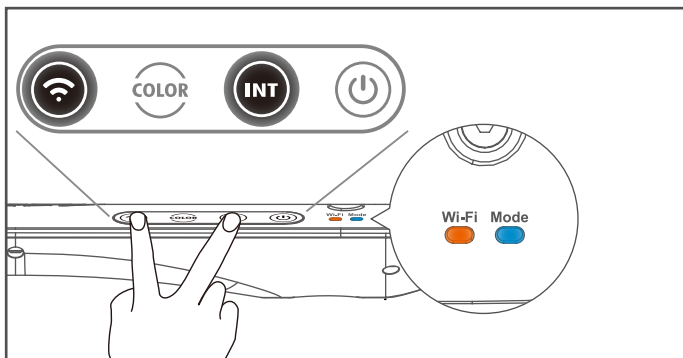
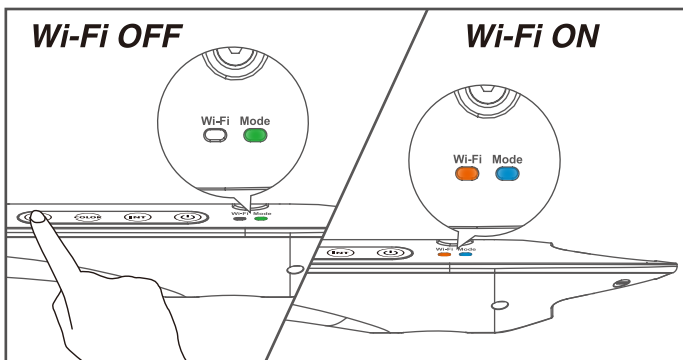
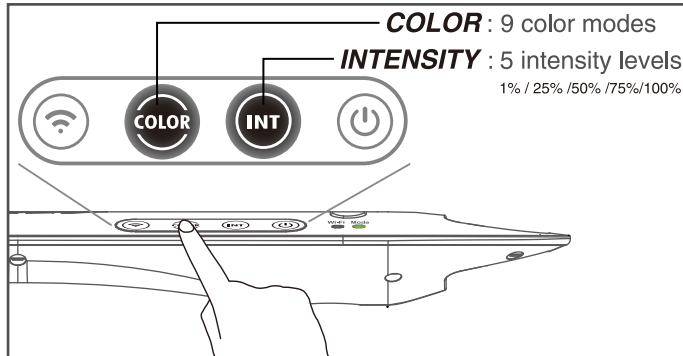
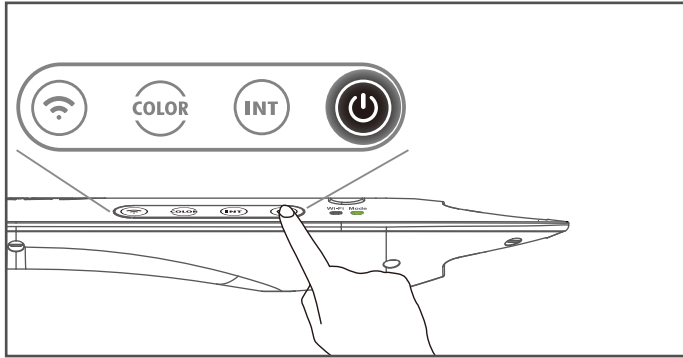


Step 3 Set up More AP9X

If you have more AP9Xs, choose "Set up Additional AP9X". Choose "Done" if you complete the setup.

TOUCH PANEL

Touch the Touch Panel (C) once to activate



• Turn On/Off the AP9X

Touch the Power (D) button to turn on/off the AP9X. When the AP9X is off, the Power (D), Intensity (E), or Color (F) buttons can be used to turn on the AP9X.

• Manual Control

Touch the Intensity (E) button and Color (F) button to adjust the intensity and color of the AP9X. Intensity levels and color modes are in cycles.

• Turn On Wi-Fi for App Connection

Touch and hold the Wi-Fi (G) button for 3 seconds to turn on Wi-Fi signal. Do the same to turn off Wi-Fi signal.

• Reset the AP9X Wi-Fi Configuration

Touch and hold the Intensity (E) & Wi-Fi (G) buttons simultaneously for 3 seconds to reset the Wi-Fi configuration (i.e. to reconnect). The Mode indicator (A) will first disappear and then **blink red** at 3 seconds. User's settings will not be deleted. The Wi-Fi Indicator (B) will change to **solid orange**.

• Factory Reset the AP9X

Touch and hold the Intensity (E), Color (F) & Wi-Fi (G) buttons simultaneously for more than 10 seconds to reset the AP9X. The Mode indicator (A) will first disappear and then **blink red** at 10 seconds. User's settings will be deleted. The Wi-Fi indicator (B) will be **solid purple** to indicate booting mode (may take up to 40 seconds) - See INSTALLATION Step 2.

Solid Purple

The AP9X requires up to 40 seconds to boot. The AP9X Wi-Fi Indicator (B) will show **solid purple** light.



Solid Orange

Standby mode, ready to be connected.



Solid Blue

AP mode. Successfully connected to mobile device and act as the master (through "Connect Directly Via Wi-Fi").



Solid Red

Attempting to connect. If it stays for more than 3 minutes, reset AP9X's WiFi configuration (Touch and hold the Intensity (E) & Wi-Fi (G) buttons simultaneously for 3 seconds) and add the AP9X in the app again.



Solid Green

STA mode. Successfully connected to wireless router or to a master Kessil Wi-Fi enabled product as slave.



Blinking Green

When updating the AP9X's firmware through Kessil WiFi app, the Wi-Fi Indicator (B) will **blink green** light.

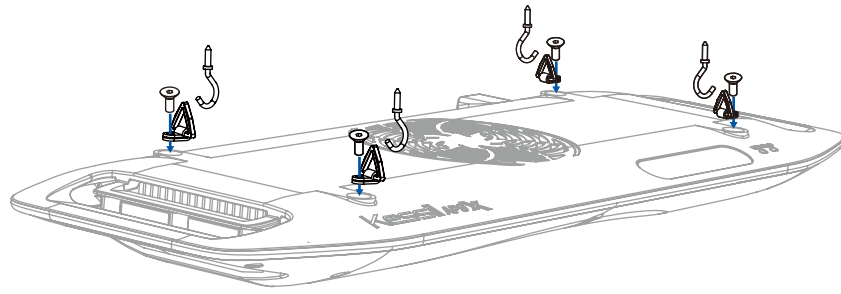

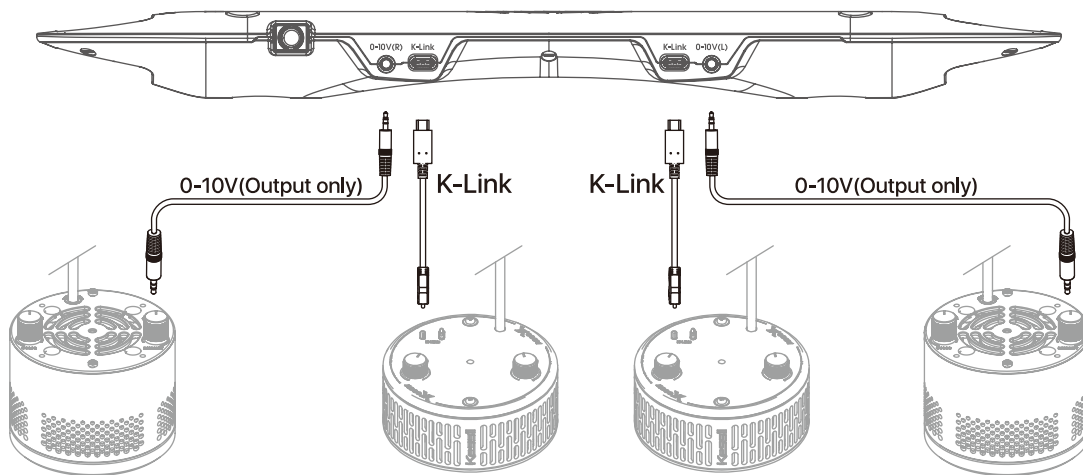
Error mode. One of the main causes is signal collision, touch and hold the Wi-Fi (G) button for 3 seconds to turn off Wi-Fi signal.

MOUNTING



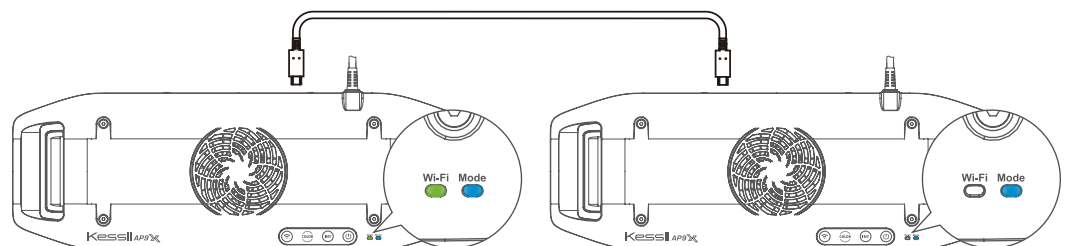
- Hang the light with the four Screw Hooks and the four Hanging Brackets.
- To install the Hanging Brackets, remove the screws on the AP9X, use the same screws to secure the fasteners with triangular rings (Hanging Brackets) onto the light fixture.

CONTROLLING MULTIPLE K-LINK & 0-10V FIXTURES



- Two K-Link ports (J): Connect and control multiple X-series K-Link fixtures using "Kessil WiFi" app and K-Link Cables. When connecting Kessil Wi-Fi enabled products, make sure to turn off the Wi-Fi signal of the slave fixtures. When controlling them (Tuna Blue only) manually, tuning controls on any light control all other lights in chain.
- Two 0-10V Output ports (K): Connect and control multiple 0-10V fixtures using "Kessil WiFi" app.

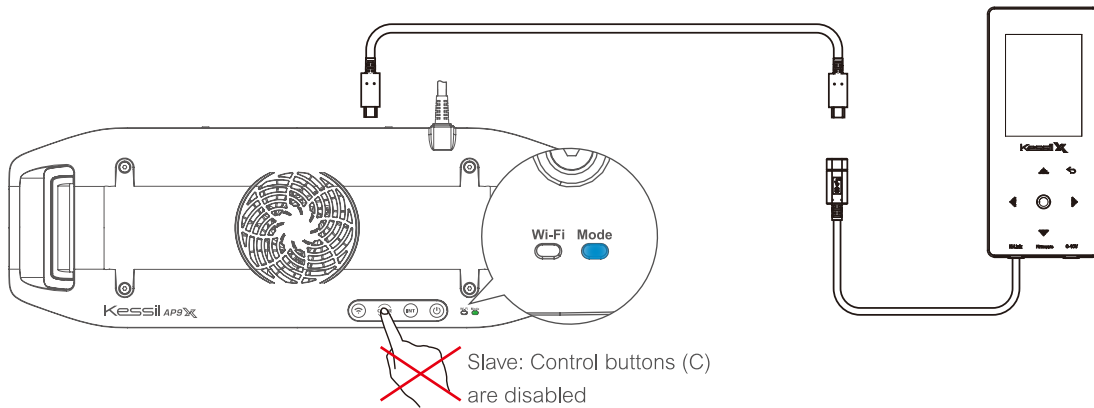
AP9X DAISY-CHAIN SCENARIO



Multiple AP9X (up to 32 K-Link fixtures) can be connected using "Kessil WiFi" app and K-Link Cables. Only the master AP9X should have Wi-Fi signal turned on (Wi-Fi indicator (B) is ON), Wi-Fi signal on the other fixtures should be OFF.

Mode Indicator (A) will be **solid blue** and control buttons are disabled.

CONTROLLED BY SPECTRAL CONTROLLER X



- AP9X can be connected and controlled through Kessil Spectral Controller X with a K-Link Cable.
- The AP9X control buttons will be disabled.

MAINTENANCE

1. Keep the Fan (Air Inlet) (H) and Vents (Air Outlet) (M) clear of dust. To clean the fan, unplug the unit and insert the tip of a CO2 dust blower (or similar dust blower) in one of the venting holes for the Fan (Air Inlet) (H). Hold and spray. You can also gently vacuum out the dusts through the venting holes.
2. Keep the LED Arrays + Reflectors (L) clean. If the array lenses and reflectors become contaminated with water, dust, or other particles, unplug the unit and clean them with isopropyl alcohol. Wet a cotton swab or a napkin in isopropyl alcohol, gently wipe the surface, and let it dry.
3. Keep plastic covers for K-Link Ports (J) and 0-10V Output Ports (K) plugged in when the ports are not in use. Keep the ports clean all-time.

TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Please make sure to perform maintenance before doing any troubleshooting.

Problem	Cause / Solution
Light doesn't turn ON	Make sure the unit is connected to the power adapter and the power adapter is plugged into an outlet with the correct specifications.
	Make sure the power adapter has the right specifications.
	Make sure electrical power is available to the AC outlet being used.
	Make sure the device is operating within the specified operating temperature range. If unit overheats, it will automatically shut down.
Unit is flickering	Make sure the power adapter has the right specifications.
	Make sure the unit has not overheated by operating at a room temperature above 100°F/40°C.
	Make sure the fan is operating properly.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

1. Caution: Misuse of this device contrary to these instructions may result in physical injury or damage to the product.
2. **DO NOT** use a power adapter outside of the specifications. This is a fire hazard and may lead to unit failure.
3. **DO NOT** use outdoors. This unit is intended for indoor use only.
4. **DO NOT** expose unit to an extremely humid environment or submerge unit in water. This may lead to unit failure.
5. **DO NOT** place working illuminator in close contact with any objects. This may cause objects to heat up and the unit to overheat.
6. **KEEP** LED Arrays + Reflectors (L) away from sharp objects. Sharp objects may break the array lens and lead to unit failure.
7. **DO NOT** cover or place objects on the power adapter. Power adapter should not be contained in an airtight space.
8. **DO NOT** block or cover the Fan (Air Inlet) (H) or Vent (Air Outlet) (M). This may cause the device to overheat and lead to failure.

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IOTA USER GUIDE

Control of Kessil A360X and AP9X lighting with APEX



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INTRODUCTION

This guide will assist you in setting up Kessil A360X Tuna Sun™, A360X Tuna Blue™, and AP9X™ LED lighting fixtures to be controlled by an Apex controller system. The A360X Refugium™ and A500™ models are not currently supported.

In this guide, you will see references to IoTa and IOTA. IoTa is an acronym of **Internet of Things: Aquarium**. IoTa is the name of an initiative created by Neptune Systems to standardize and facilitate development of Apex control of Internet-connected aquarium equipment such as the Kessil A360X™ and AP9X™ LED lights.

REQUIREMENTS

- An Apex or ApexEL is required; this capability is not available in Apex Classic models, which include the Apex Classic, Apex Gold, Apex Lite, and Apex Jr.
- The Apex must have AOS version 5.06_7F21 (or later) installed.
- The Apex must be connected to the local network via Wi-Fi or Ethernet.
- The Kessil LED lights which will be directly controlled by the Apex must be connected over Wi-Fi to the same network as the Apex.

SYSTEM ARCHITECTURE

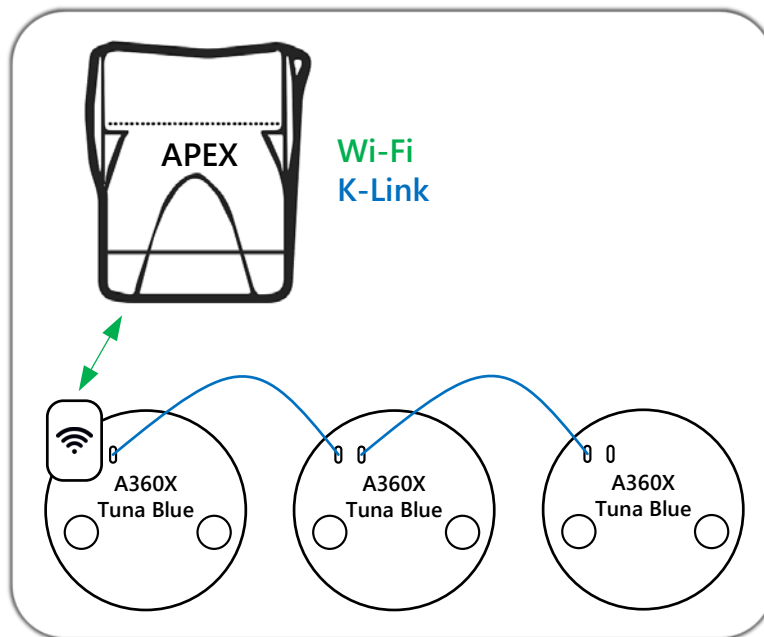
- Kessil A360X Tuna Blue and Tuna Sun lights equipped with a WiFi Dongle may be directly controlled by the Apex.
- Kessil A360X lights *of the same model (Tuna Sun or Tuna Blue)* which are not equipped with a WiFi Dongle may be connected to an A360X controlled by an Apex by using a K-Link cable; additional A360X without WiFi Dongles may be daisy-chained with K-Link. If the Kessil lights are connected this way, the daisy-chain lights will mirror the light being controlled by the Apex.
- Kessil AP9X lights in Apex-controlled mode will be directly controlled by the Apex.
- Kessil AP9X lights not in Apex-controlled mode may be connected to an AP9X controlled by an Apex by using a K-Link cable; additional AP9X may be daisy-chained with K-Link.
- Each IoTa device being directly controlled by an Apex counts as an Apex module and is subject to the Apex limit of 49 modules.



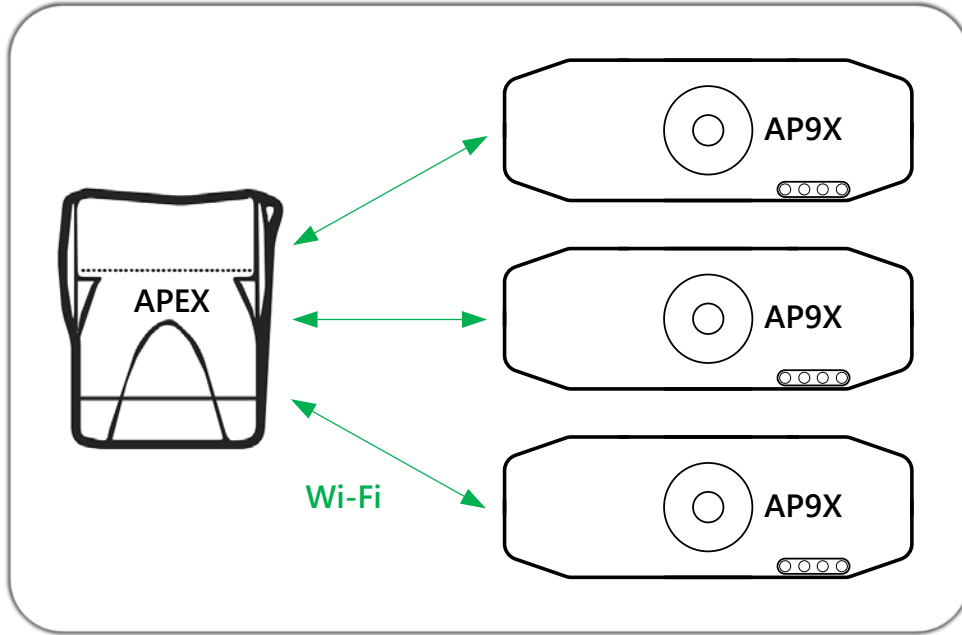
Do not mix light models and variants of the same model in the same K-Link chain.

- ⊘ Do not link AP9X and A360X with Wi-Fi Dongle together using K-Link.
- ⊘ Do not link A360X Tuna Sun and A360X Tuna Blue lights together using K-Link.

If you have multiple lights of the same model and type, and you wish to control all lights together with the same lighting schedule, then only one AP9X or one WiFi Dongle-equipped A360X should be in Apex-controlled mode, and other lights be daisy-chained from that light. This configuration offers simplicity; only the Apex-controlled light needs to have a lighting schedule assigned in the Apex; the other lights will automatically follow that same schedule.

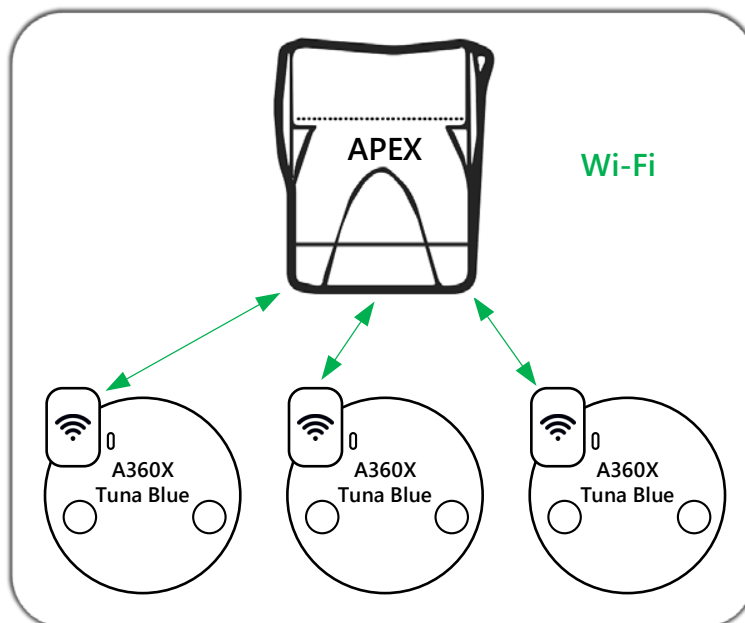


Apex controlling a K-Link chain of A360X

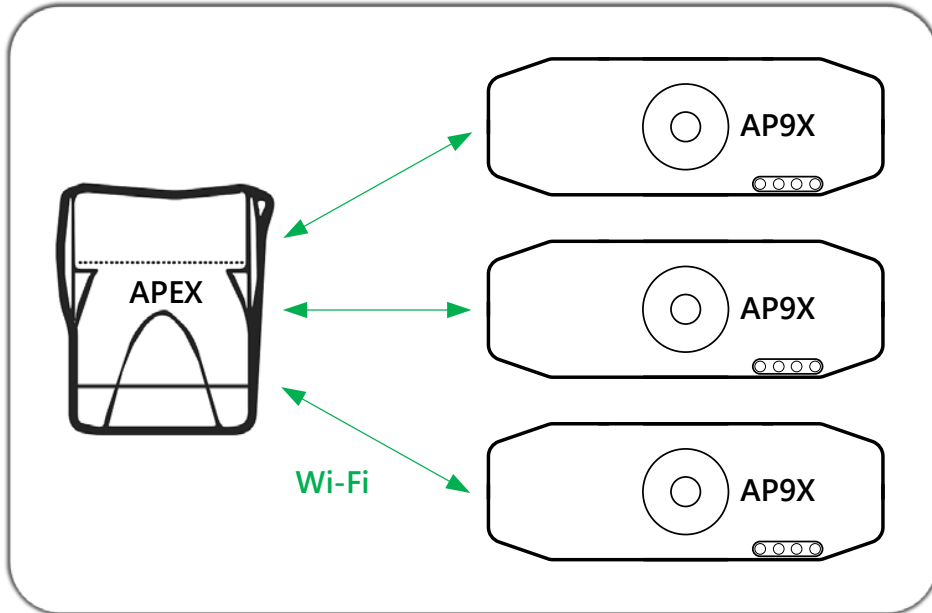


Apex controlling a K-Link chain of AP9X

If you have multiple lights of the same model and type (A360X Tuna Sun or A360X Tuna Blue), and you wish to control each light independently, each light must have a dongle and each should be configured in Apex-controlled mode. This offers the most flexibility, but the lighting schedule for each light must be set separately.

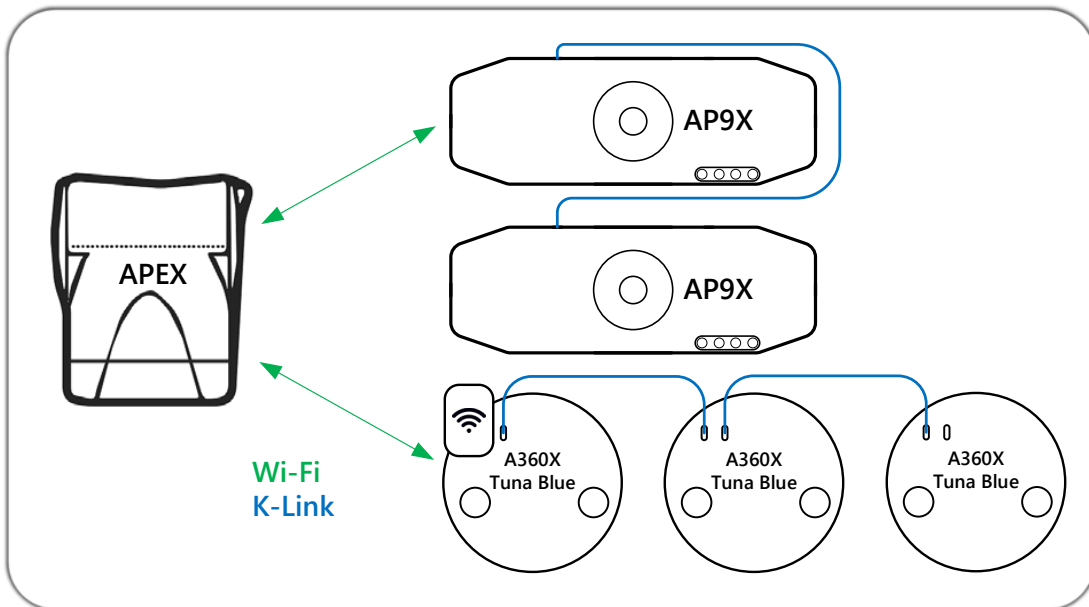


Apex independently controlling three A360X

If you have both AP9X lights and A360X lights, you may control each light individually, or you may form two chains of K-Linked lights of the same model.



Apex controlling chains of both AP9X and A360X

The Apex supports a maximum of 12 IoTa devices of any type, which includes:

- Kessil A360X equipped with a WiFi Dongle and configured in Apex control mode
- Kessil AP9X configured in Apex control mode
- Aqualllumination Prime, Prime HD, Hydra 26HD, and Hydra 52HD under Apex control
- Sicce Syncra SDC™ pumps and XStream SDC™ pumps which have been upgraded for IoTa and Apex control

This limit applies to all IoTa devices on the local wireless network; there can be no more than 12 present.

Examples:

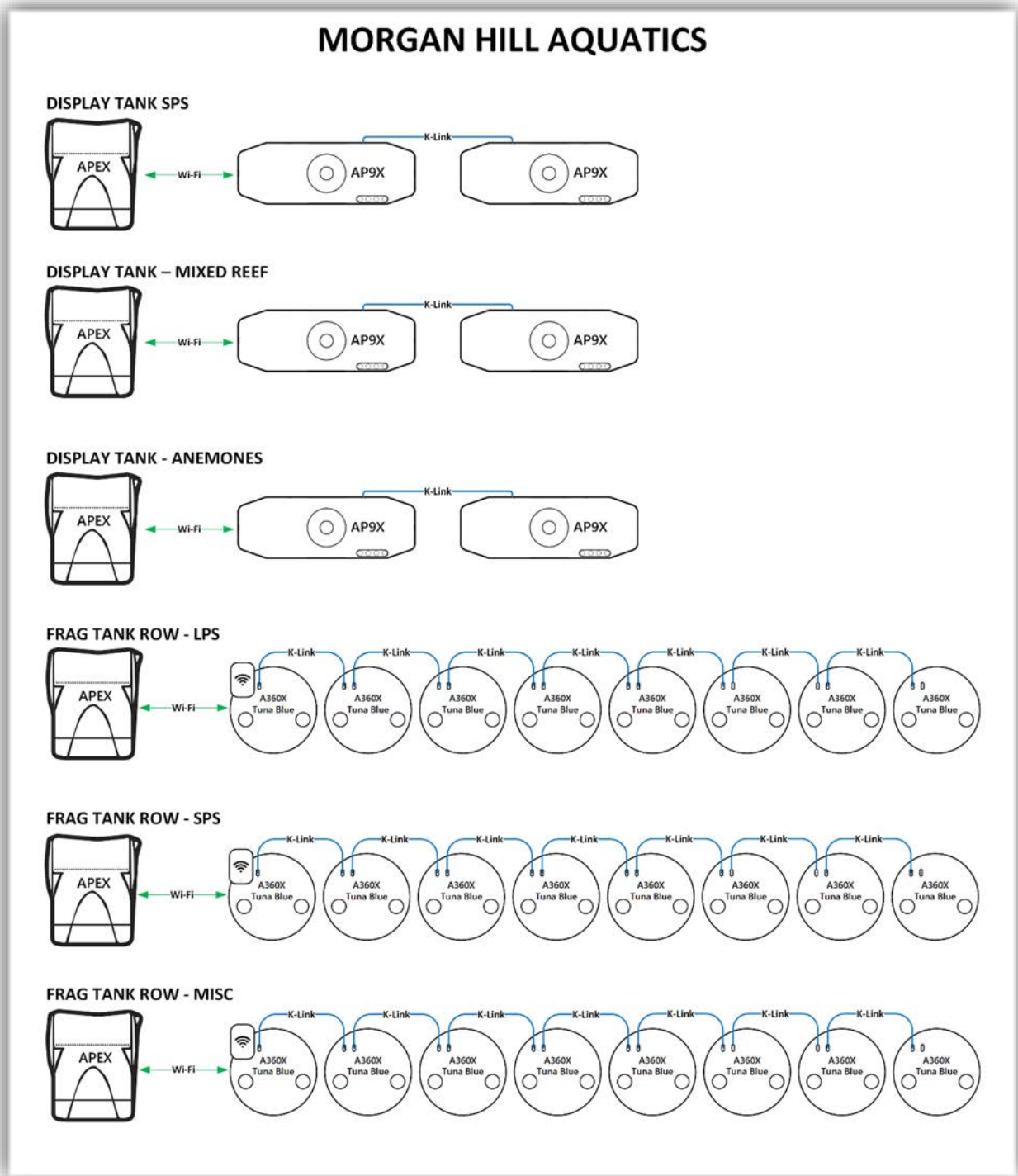
1. You have (6) A360X equipped with WiFi Dongles, (2) Sicce Syncra SDC pumps, and (2) Sicce XStream SDC power heads. This is a total of 12 IoTa devices, and all of these devices may be controlled by a single Apex, or some may be controlled by one Apex, and other controlled by another Apex.
2. You have (6) A360X equipped with WiFi Dongles, (2) AP9X, (2) Sicce Syncra SDC pumps, and (2) Sicce XStream SDC power heads. This is a total of 14 devices, which exceeds the limit of 12. To reduce the number of devices present on the network, use K-Link cables to daisy-chain the AP9X lights, some of the A360X, or some combination thereof as needed to reduce the totally quantity of IoTa devices to 12 or less.

For larger installations involving more than 12 Kessil lights, special consideration must be given to ensure the 12 item limit is observed. For stores, coral farms, etc., it will generally be optimal to handle raceways or rows of frag tanks with one light being directly Apex-controlled, and the remaining lights in each row or each raceway be daisy-chained using K-Link.

Let's take a store as an example.

- It has 3 saltwater display tanks in the showroom, each with 2 AP9X
- Each display tank's pair of lights must be able to be controlled separately
- The store also has 3 long rows of frag tanks, each with 8 A360X
- All frag tanks in any given row can have the same lighting schedule, but each row must be able to have a different schedule
- Each display tank has a dedicated Apex system
- Each row of frag tanks has a dedicated Apex system

To meet these goals and to stay within the limit of 12 active IoTa devices, the lighting could be configured using a mixture of some lights with direct Apex control and the remaining lights daisy-chained from those lights, as seen in this image:



The depicted layout offers simplicity and ease of use, has the flexibility to meet the different requirements of the various types of livestock, yet still allows ample room for growth.

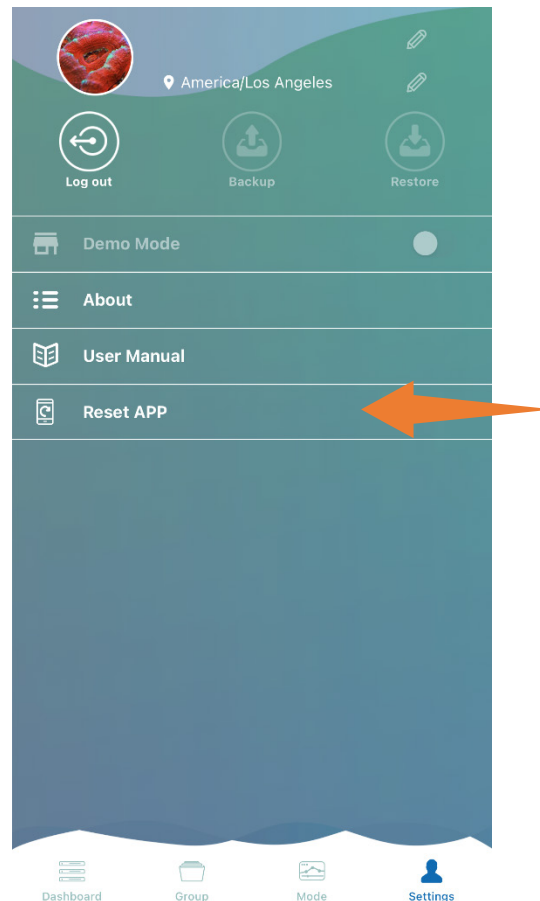
PREPARING YOUR KESSIL LIGHT TO BE CONTROLLED BY THE APEX



If you are changing existing Kessil lighting from control via the Kessil WiFi app to Apex control, take screenshots or make notes about your current lighting schedule now so you can recreate your current lighting schedule in the Apex after the lights are under Apex control.

After installing the latest version of the Kessil WiFi app:

1. Reset all lights (AP9X and WiFi Dongle-equipped A360X).
2. Reset the app; tap Settings at the bottom, then tap Reset App.



3. Follow the setup instructions in the [Kessil WiFi app manual](#). Use the “Through Wireless Router” method **after** enabling the **Apex Fusion control ONLY** option. When performing this step, the AP9X or the WiFi Dongle must be configured to connect to the same network as the Apex which will be used to control it.



If a firmware update is available for the AP9X or the WiFi Dongle, it will be installed during the process of configuring the Kessil light for your wireless network.

4. When the configuration process through the app has completed, it will be ready to attach to your Apex.




After you complete the setup of each AP9X or WiFi Dongle-equipped A360X with *Apex Fusion control ONLY* enabled, it will no longer be visible in the app.

PROVIDING POWER TO YOUR KESSIL LIGHT




The power supplies for A360X and AP9X lights do not need to be plugged into an EnergyBar outlet; instead, they should be plugged into a regular wall outlet or power strip. Neptune Systems recommends that the power supplies for A360X and AP9X lights not be plugged into an EnergyBar outlet. However, if you do, the EnergyBar outlet should be programmed to be always ON. You can use the APEX Fusion “Always” Task to

configure the EnergyBar outlet to be always On, or if you prefer to program it yourself, use this simple program:

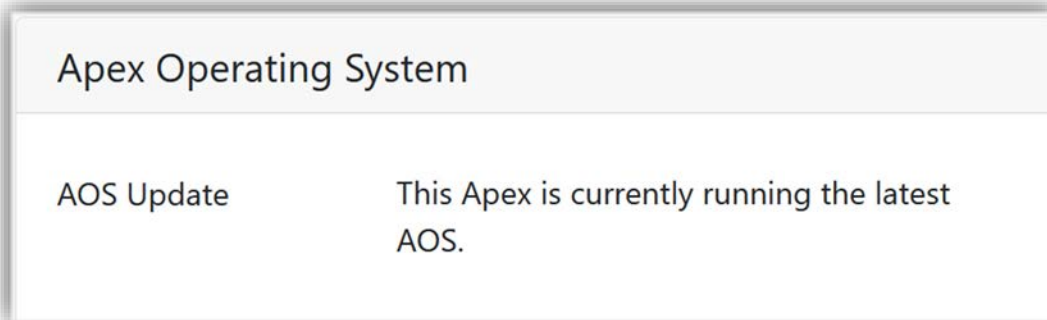

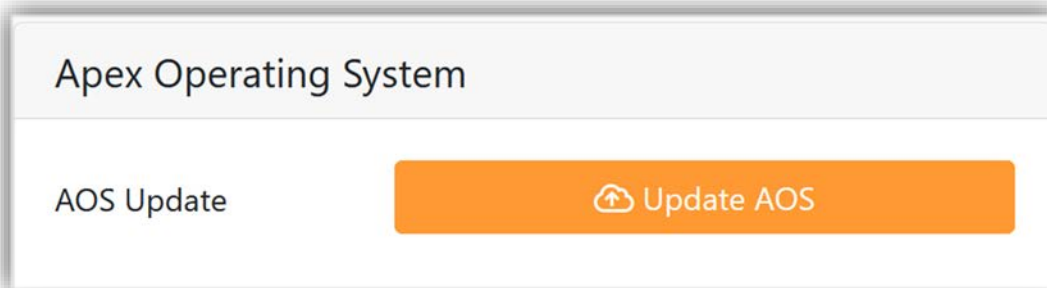
UPDATING YOUR APEX AOS

Your Apex must have AOS version 5.06_7F21 or later installed. You can check for the availability of a newer AOS than installed and install an AOS update if one is available using either APEX Local or APEX Fusion. On the **Dashboard** , click the **Expand**  button, then click the **Network**  button.

The page will either show that no update is needed, or that an AOS is available to install.




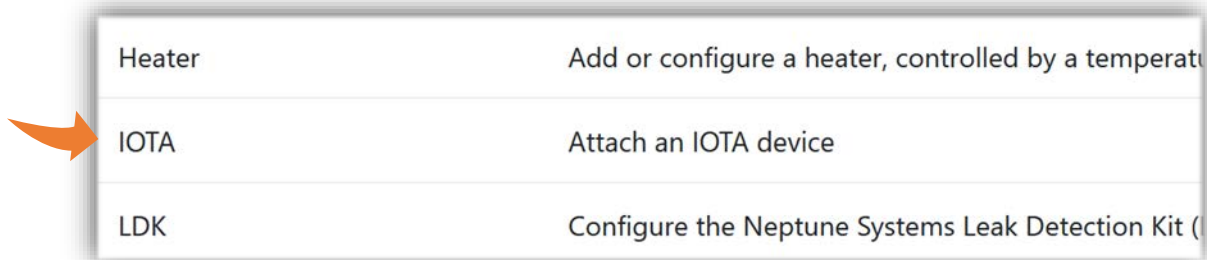

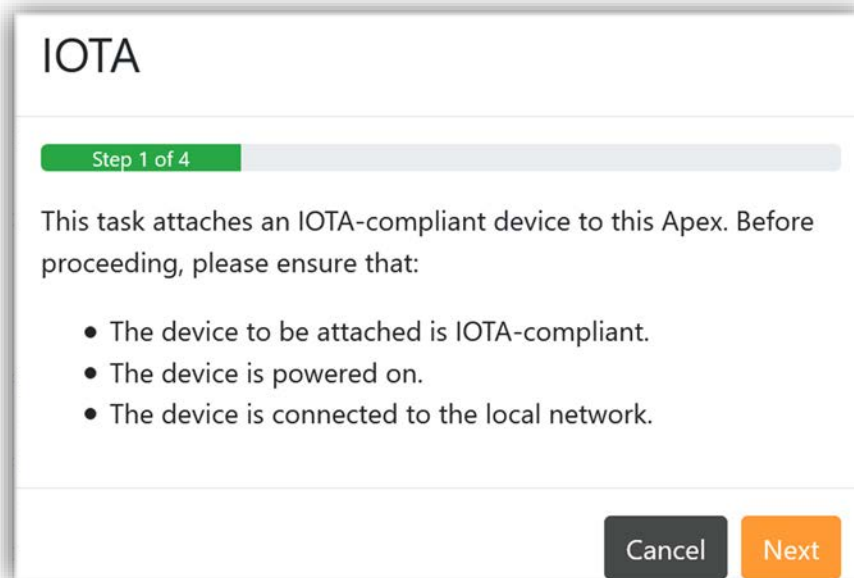
If an update is available, click the  **Update AOS** button, then follow the prompts. Wait at least 15 minutes after the AOS update process completes before proceeding.

ATTACHING A KESSIL LIGHT TO THE APEX USING THE APEX FUSION IOTA TASK

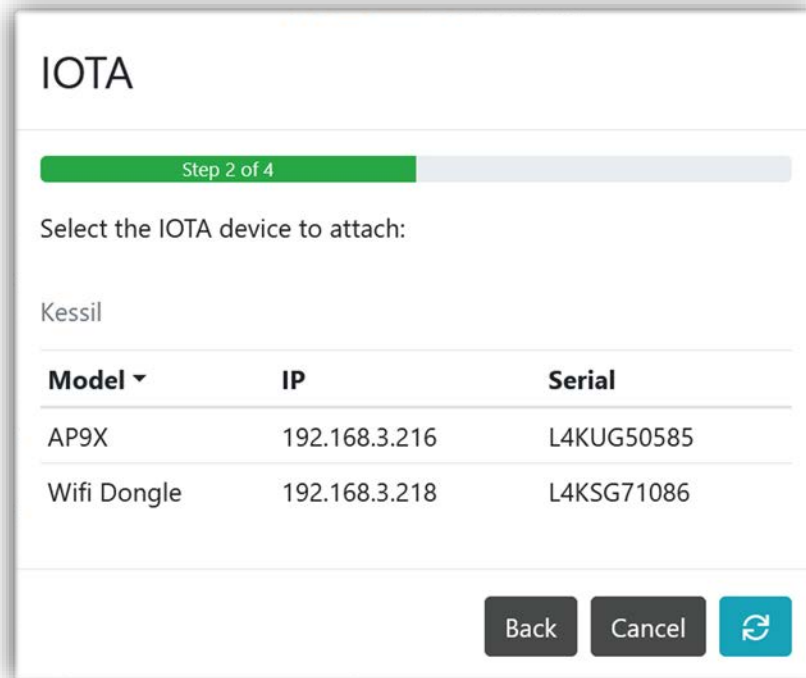
The process of configuring an Apex to control an A360X™ or AP9X™ is called “attaching”. The simplest and preferred method of attaching an A360X™ or AP9X™ is by use of the IOTA Task in APEX Fusion (not APEX Local). While viewing your Apex dashboard, click on the **Tasks**  button; then click on the IOTA Task:



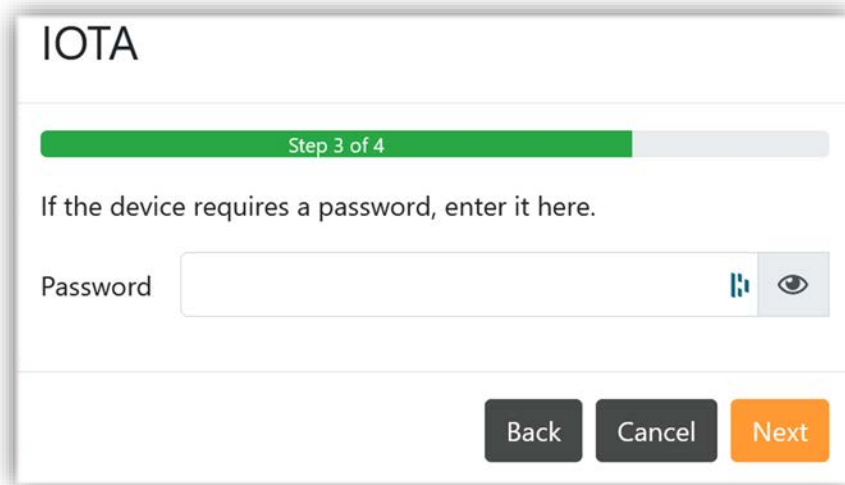
Follow the IOTA Task steps. Step 1 is a summary of what the task does and the basic requirements to be able to attach the Kessil light to the Apex:



In Step 2, you will be presented a list of all compatible lights and pumps that the Apex has discovered on your network and which are not already attached to this Apex. In the image below, you can see that one AP9X and one Wifi Dongle (A360X) were found. The Serial displayed here is the same as the one printed on the QR-Code stickers which came with your lights. Click on the light you wish to attach, then click the **Next** button.



Some IoTa devices may optionally be configured with a password, or may require the use of a password when setting this up for control by an Apex. Kessil lights do not use a password. In Step 3, just skip the password entry and click the **Next** button.

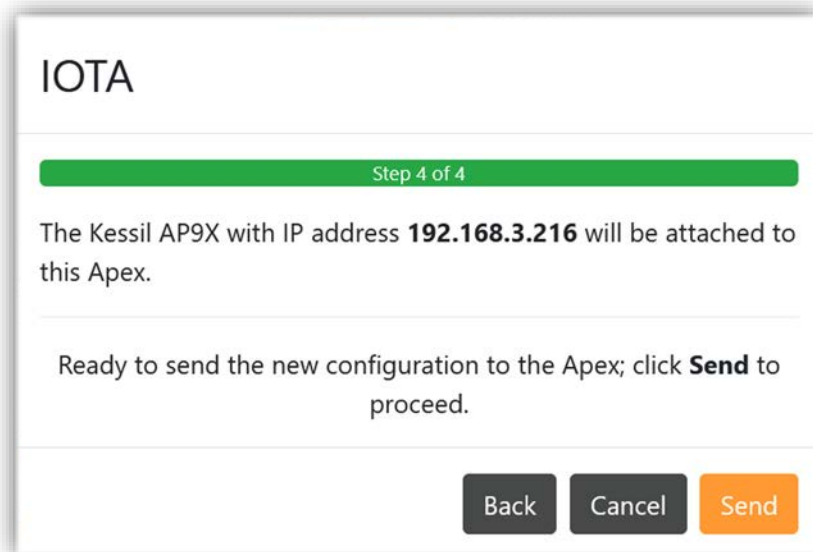

ATTACHING A KESSIL LIGHT TO THE APEX USING THE MODULES LIST IN APEX LOCAL OR APEX FUSION

As an alternative to using the APEX Fusion IOTA Task, A360X or AP9X lights may be attached using the Modules view in either APEX Fusion or APEX Local.

While viewing your Apex dashboard, click on the **Expand**  button, then click the **Modules**  button. A listing of all connected modules will be shown:

Click on the **Add IOTA Module**  button in the upper right. You will be presented with a list of all compatible IoTa devices that the Apex has discovered on your network and which are not already attached to this Apex. Click on the line for Kessil light you wish to attach, then click the **OK** button.

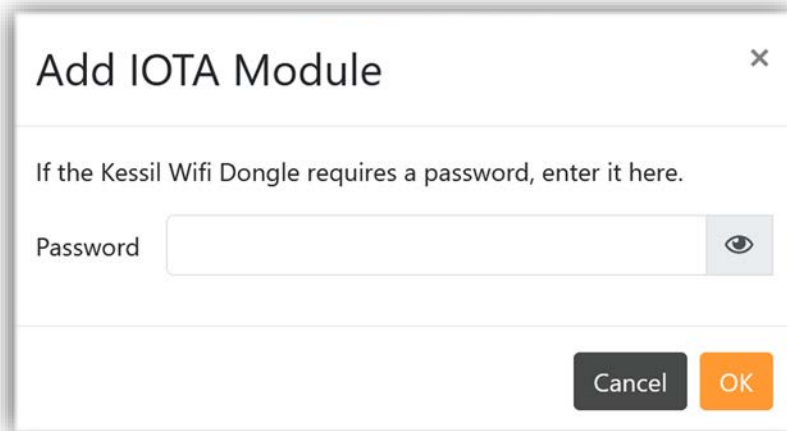

Some IoTa devices may optionally be configured with a password, or may require the use of a password when setting this up for control by an Apex. Kessil lights currently do not use a password. Skip the password entry and click the **OK** button.

It may take a minute or so if you are using APEX Fusion before the newly-added light appears as a module.

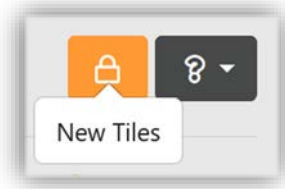

When IoTa devices such as A360X or AP9X are attached to the Apex, new outputs and dashboard tiles will automatically be created. Outputs will appear in the **Outputs** view. The Apex outputs for the A360X and AP9X which were attached earlier can be seen in this image:

The default output name for any Kessil IoTa device is **Kessilxx_#_1**; The xx will be **TB** (for Tuna Blue) or **TS** (for Tuna Sun), and # is the Aquabus address of the IoTa module.

Now go back to the **Dashboard** ; it will show the New Tiles indicator:



Click the **Unlock**  button to show the hidden tiles area, then locate and drag the new tile(s) named KessilTB_#_1, and/or KessilTS_#_1 onto your dashboard and position each one where desired. When done, close the hidden tiles area by clicking on the **Lock**  button again.

MIGRATING A LIGHTING SCHEDULE FROM KESSIL APP TO APEX

Skip to the next section if you have not previously used the Kessil app to control your lights.

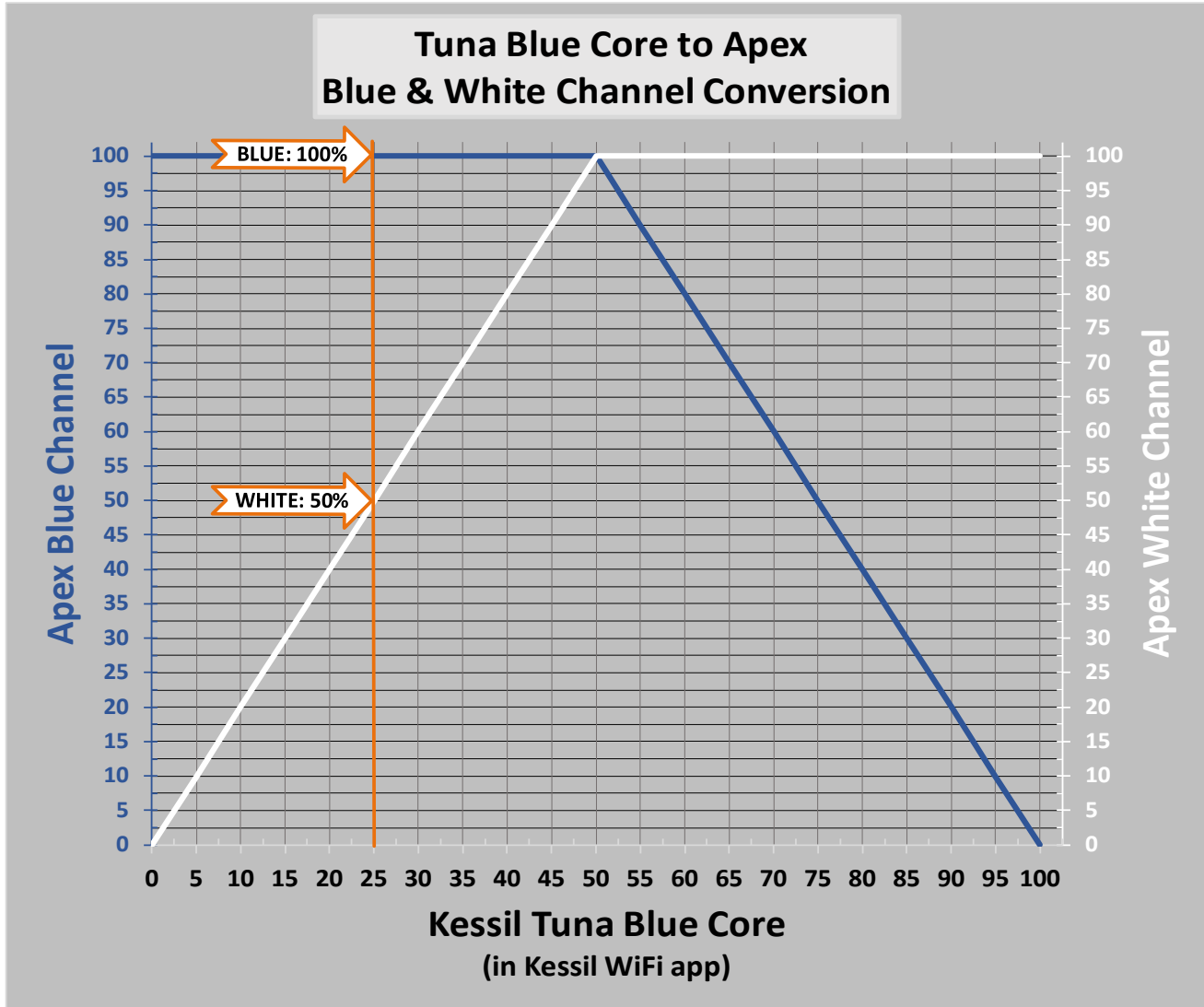
Schedules created in the Kessil WiFi app cannot be directly converted or imported into APEX Local or APEX Fusion. If you are changing existing Kessil lighting from control via the Kessil WiFi app to Apex control, take screenshots or make notes about your current lighting schedule so you can refer to them when recreating your current lighting schedule in the Apex.

In the Kessil app, the Kessil Tuna Blue Core (blue and white) is controlled by a single setting which is continuously variable between all blue and all white. Similarly, for Tuna Sun lights, the Tuna Sun Core is continuously variable between 6000K and 9000K white. When under Apex control, blue and white for Tuna Blue lights are split into separate channels. When under Apex control, the Tuna Sun Core is split into separate 6000K and 9000K channels.

In order to facilitate an easy migration from Kessil app to Apex, use these conversion charts to convert from an Kessil app schedule to Apex schedule.

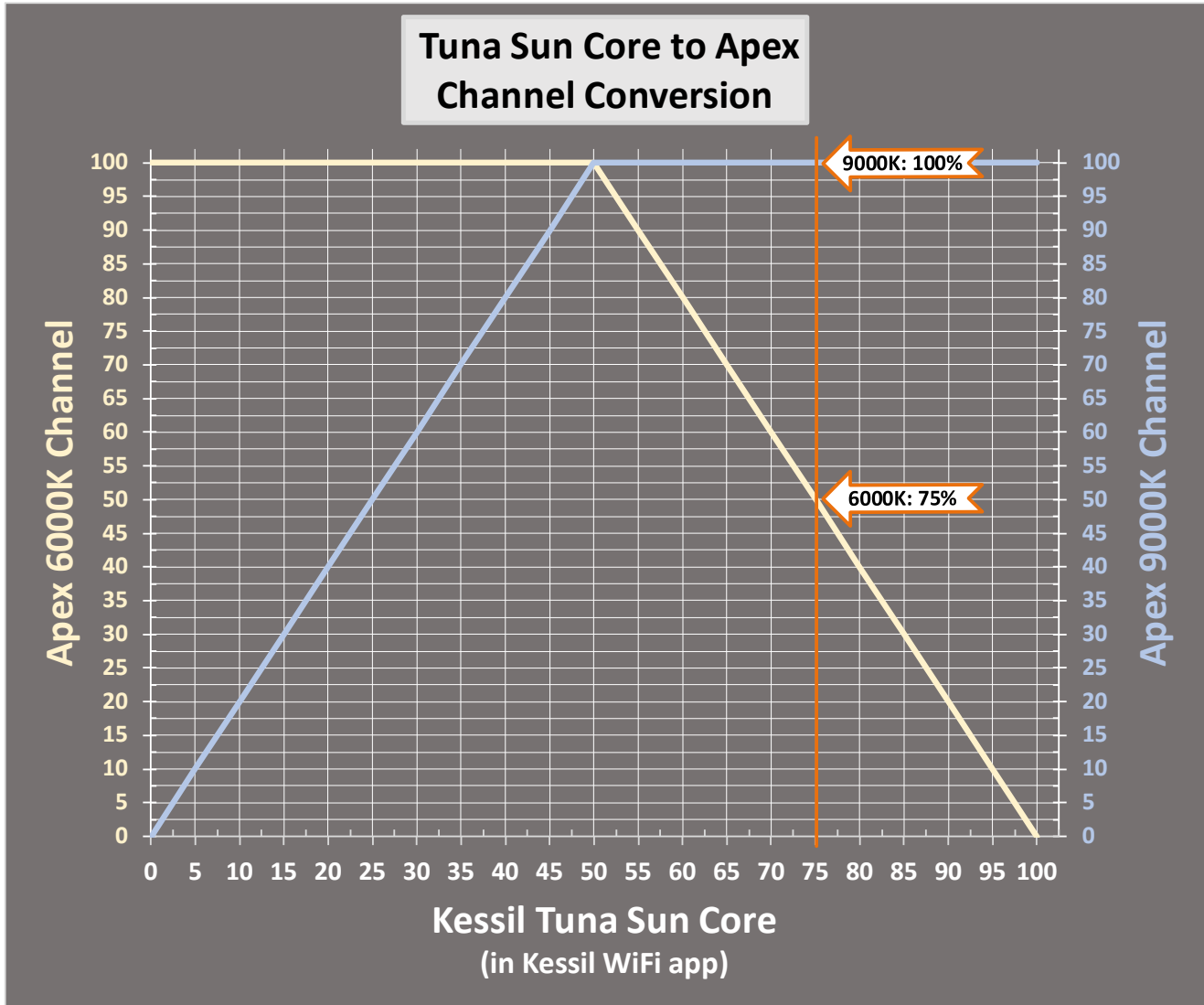

This same conversion is presented in graphical form below, along with an example for both Tuna Blue and Tuna Sun lights.



EXAMPLE


You have been using a value of 25 percent in the Kessil WiFi app. To convert that into Apex spectrum slider values for Blue and White, draw an imaginary line upward from 25% on the Tuna Blue axis; the points where that line intersect the blue and white lines are the values to use in the Apex schedule for that light.

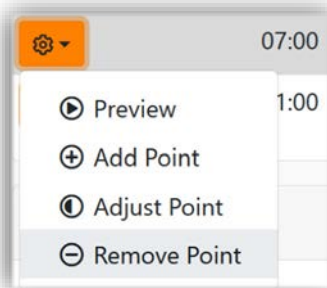
You have been using a value of 75% percent in the Kessil WiFi app. To convert that into Apex spectrum slider values for Blue and White, draw an imaginary line upward from 75% on the Tuna Sun axis; the points where that line intersect the bluish and whitish lines are the values to use in the Apex schedule for that light.


CREATING A SCHEDULE FOR YOUR KESSIL LIGHT

To create a schedule for your newly-attached Kessil light, locate its dashboard tile and click the  on the tile. The lighting wizard with a sample lighting schedule will be shown. Use this as starting point.

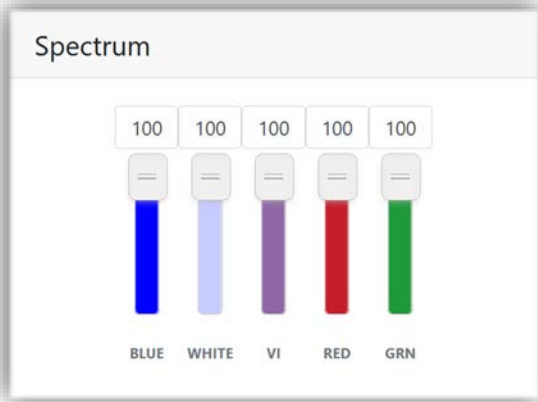


Modify the schedule as desired by dragging each schedule points to adjust the time and overall intensity. Add an additional schedule point by clicking on the  for a point then clicking on Add Point. You can also adjust the time and intensity for a point, or remove a point.

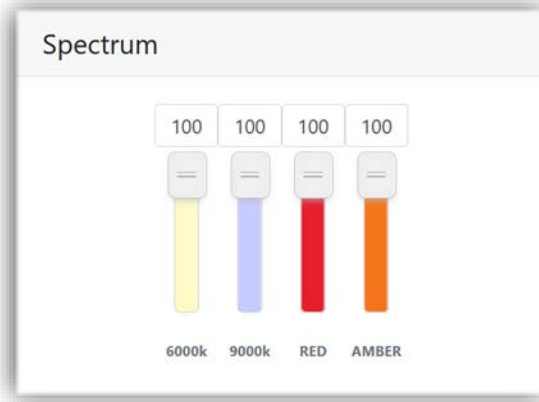


For each point, choose the color spectrum desired. Optionally, enable random cloudy effects for a point by clicking in the checkbox next to the  symbol.

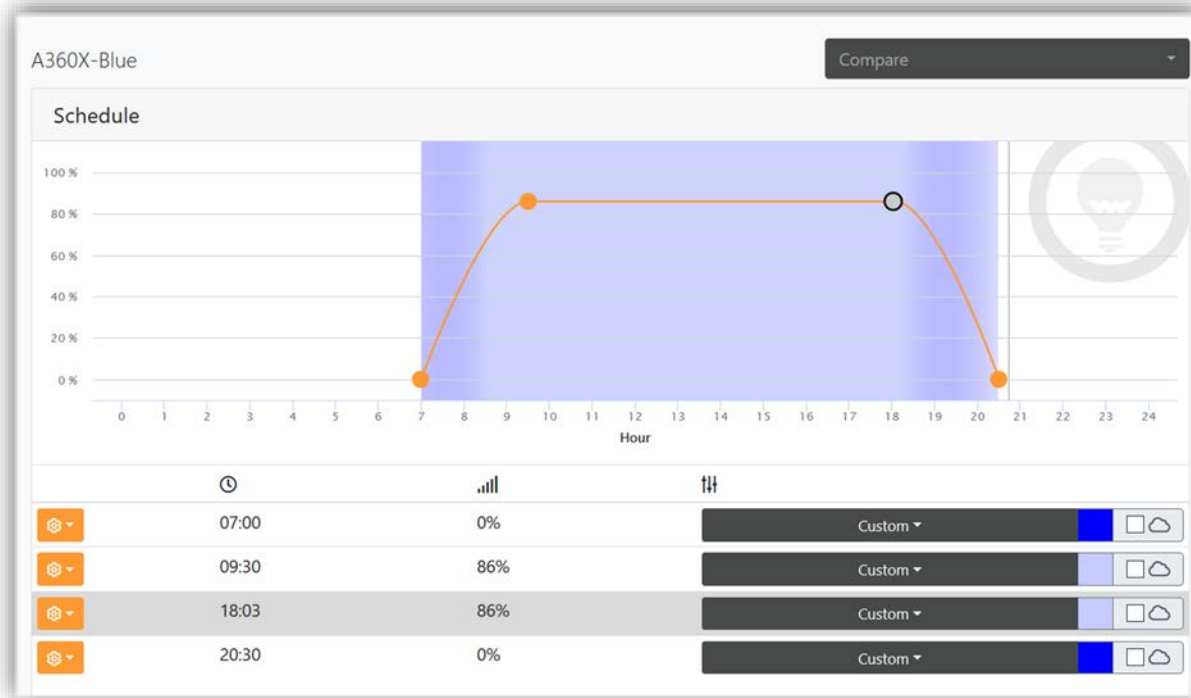
To define a custom spectrum, use the vertical sliders in the Spectrum box to adjust the desired intensity for each color channel.

After creating your lighting schedule, assign a custom name to the output by clicking on the **Configuration**  in the upper right corner.



Edit the default output name to give it a descriptive and meaningful name; click the **OK** button when done.

LIGHTING SCHEMES

The IoTa lighting wizard in APEX Fusion supports the use of Schemes, which are lighting schedules that can be saved for your own later use and can also be shared with other Apex owners.

- To save a lighting schedule as a Scheme, click the **Save Scheme**  button.
- To search for Schemes shared by others, click the **Download Scheme**  button. Schemes are available only in APEX Fusion; they are not available in APEX Local.
- You can save a Scheme, then load it onto another IoTa light of the same model.
- Schemes are vendor- and model-specific:
 - ❌ A Scheme created from a Aqualllumination brand light, for example, cannot be used with a Kessil output.
 - ❌ A Scheme created from a AP9X cannot be used with a A360X.
 - ❌ A Scheme created from a A360X Tuna Sun cannot be used with A360 Tuna Blue.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- ❖ The use of Apex profiles is not supported with IoTa outputs.
- ❖ Schedules created in the Kessil WiFi app cannot be converted or imported into APEX Local or APEX Fusion.
- ❖ Fallback is not supported.

Additional detail about an attached Kessil light is available on the Modules view. To see that information, start on the **Dashboard** . Click or tap on the **Expand**  button, click or tap the **Modules**  button, then select the desired IOTA Module. You will see the detailed status on the IOTA Module view:

Of primary interest here is the model and IP address of the Kessil light. Note that A360X lights will appear here as “Wifi Dongle”.

The serial number shown here is the same as the identifier on the QR code sticker that came with each Kessil light.
